New Tools for Recently Laid-Off Workers

(NAPSA)—Recently laid-off workers now have access to information about jobs, job training and other career resources through America's Workforce Network Toll-Free Help Line (1-877-US-2JOBS) and America's Service Locator (www.servicelocator.org).

By providing the Toll-Free Help Line customer service representative (CSR) with area and zip code, laid-off workers can find the nearest location for service in their area or anywhere in the country, including the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.

Have access to the Internet? Then go to www.servicelocator.org. America's Service Locator is a Web-based database that contains location and service information, including maps and telephone numbers, of the nearest service provider.
